Guillermo moved with his family to Weston when he was eight years old. He loved his home in Florida and in Puerto Rico. He was a young man who found great joy in the simple pleasures of life. He was full of energy, loved being on the soccer fields and a joy to be around. He exemplified the AYSO philosophies and was always available to help out on the soccer fields. He was an amazing volunteer in our soccer program. Guillermo, and the Diaz family, will always remain a part of our AYSO Family.

All athletes who applied needed to show that he/she shares Guillermo's passion for helping others, by being an active volunteer recognized not only by an AYSO staff member but also from a school teacher regarding his/her character and commitment to community service. AYSO believes that supporting and endorsing these positive attitudes contribute for a better community. AYSO has been presenting this award annually since Guillermo's untimely passing and this will be the 10<sup>th</sup> scholarship awarded in his name.



#### What is AYSO?

AYSO Region 644 is one of the hundreds of regions that make up the American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO), which is a national association that was founded in 1964 and is located in Hawthorne, California. With over 500,000 boys and girls between the ages of 4 - 18 years old and 250,000 volunteer coaches, referees and administrators in 46 states, AYSO is the largest volunteer soccer organization of its kind.

In 1988, West Broward AYSO changed its name to AYSO Region 644 serving the communities of Weston, Pembroke Pines, Sunrise, and all of the other neighboring cities. In these twenty-five plus years, we have grown from 300 youth players to approximately 3,750 players in fall and spring leagues, adults in various divisions, playground for 2 years old and up, and VIP program for challenged kids. AYSO provides programming for thousands of families every year.

AYSO has 6 philosophies that their players should learn and practice, not only in soccer, but in life:

- 1- <u>Everyone Plays</u>: it's important to improve and to become better in what we do every day, but it's also important to give everyone a chance to enjoy sport and have fun!
- 2- <u>Open Registration</u>: there's no requirements to register at AYSO. The organization offers different groups based on age and recreational or competitive playing. There is also a program for emotionally and physically challenged individuals, so that everyone may play!
- 3- <u>Positive Coaching</u>: learning skills and techniques is very important, but so it is learning how to enjoy practicing sports!
- 4- Balanced Teams: AYSO wants to make sure everyone will learn, play and have fun!
- 5- <u>Good Sportsmanship</u>: winning is important, but how someone plays may be even more important, even if it doesn't end up winning.
- 6- <u>Player Development</u>: It is important that each player improve. AYSO provides top level training for the youngest kids when they are most capable of developing into future stars!
